The social structure of most developing countries no longer consists of a tiny upper class confronting a very large and mainly rural lower class, as earlier stereotypes had it. Intermediate strata have grown and diversified until they are, in atleast some respects (recruitment to position of power, control of major political movements) dominant. In almost all of these countries, however, the 'middle strata' remain minorities (sometimes very small minorities) and have not achieved sufficient homogeneity of characteristics and interests to entitle them to the label of class. The key differences between them and the middle classes in the past of the countries that are now industrialised or developed seem to be the following: first, the much greater importance of the role of formal education in giving access to middle (as well as upper) status; second, the much greater importance of salaried employment, particularly in the public sector, in relation to selfemployment in the professions or in small businesses; third, the presence of the 'demonstration effect' from the high income countries continually tending to stretch consumption aspirations beyond income capacity. Independent, frugal,

entrepreneurially minded middle groups can still be identified, and some of them are coping resiliently with economic globalisation and other challenges. However, many factors in the situations in which they have found themselves- technological dependency, the dominance of large-scale enterprises, the bureaucratisation of the rules of the game- generally restricted them to secondary roles in economic evolution. Their educational aspiration for their children have been likely to divert most of these into bureaucratic or professional occupations. Moreover, in many cases, they have belonged to cultural minorities or alien immigrant groups encountering resistance once they become economically conspicuous


A global light pollution map developed by a group of researchers has ranked New Delhi, Kolkotta and Bengaluru as the three cities with the highest light pollution in India. It should serve to alert us to the looming problem of light pollution about which we are not only doing so little to prevent but are also unaware about. Light pollution refers to the harmful impact of artificial outdoor lighting. While artificial outdoor lighting is needed in the form of street lights it increases safety on roads and enables us to study and work in the dark, its use for flood lighting, illumination, advertising, etc has grown manifold in recent decades, resulting in the problem of light pollution. The need for a theory of justice relates to the discipline of engagement in reasoning about a subject on which it is as eminent author Burke noted, very difficult to speak. It is sometimes claimed that justice is not a matter of reasoning at all; it is one of being appropriately sensitive and having the right note for injustice. It is easy to be tempted to think along these lines. When we find, for example, a raging femine, it seems natural to protest rather than reason elaborately about justice and injustice. And yet a calamity would be a case of injustice only if it could have been prevented, and particularly if those who could have undertaken preventive action had failed to try. Reasoning in some form cannot but be involved in moving from the observation of a tragedy to the diagnosis of injustice.

Furthermore, cases of injustice may be much more complex and subtle than the assessment of an observable calamity. There could be different arguments suggesting disparate conclusions, and evaluations of justice may be anything but straight forward. The avoidance of reasoned justification often comes not from indignant protestors but from placid guardians of order and justice. Group work can easily get out of hand in the excitement, controversy, and natural dialogue that can come from passionate discussion. This possibility requires you to place limits on each stage of the cooperativelearning activity, so one stage does not take time from another and leave thetask disjointed and incomplete in your learners' minds. Most time naturally will be devoted to the work of individual groups, during which the majorportion of the end product will be completed. Individual group work normally will consume 60% to 80% of the time devoted to the cooperative learning activity. The remaining time must be divided among individual grouppresentations and/or whole class discussion and debriefing that places the group work into the perspective of a single end product. If you plan bothgroup reports and whole class discussion for the same day, be aware that the discussion probably will get squeezed into a fraction of the time required tomake it meaningful. To avoid this, the group discussion or debriefing for thefollowing class day may be so scheduled so that class members have ampletime to reflect on their group reports and to pull together their own thoughts about the collaborative process, which may or may not have occured as intended. Providing 15 or 20 minutes at the beginning of class the next day is usually enough time for students to have acquired the proper distance to reflect meaningfully on their experiences of the day before -and to learn from them.



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

With qualitative transformation of technology, it was no longer possible for the skilled craftsman to participate in production without transcending the boundaries of training and moving into the work of education.
